Yes, they were designed and built by Charter Parishioners, Richard and Ann Soltysiak.

• Where will we park while the parking lot is being done?

The parking lot will be done in phases, so we will be able to utilize it during construction.

• How are we going to pay for this renovation?

We will be working with the Diocese on a capital campaign project.

GIRM/DIOCESAN REQUIREMENTS

Fr. Bill Rutkowski explained some of the GIRM and Diocesan requirements to the worship area.

- ◆ The proposed plan for our parish addresses the very practical aspects of updating our Worship space that is worn with age as well as issues such as energy efficient lighting, ADA restroom facilities, parking lot problems, sacristy and office space.
- The proposed plan also addresses our Worship Space issues. The Worship Space is special and sacred. It must be beautiful and reverent and evoke an atmosphere of prayer.
- Unlike a person's home whose décor is dictated by personal taste, the contents and materials of the Worship Space of a Church is directed by Diocesan Guidelines which conform us to Church documents issued by the

- United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), Built of Living Stones and the 2002 General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) approved by the USCCB and confirmed by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments (Rome) in 2003.
- ◆ The Roman Missal is the Book used at Mass that contains all of the Ritual prayers and texts for the celebration of Mass throughout the year as well as the GIRM which gives us instruction on the Worship Space including the content, location and materials of Liturgical furnishings, vessels, and vestments. The New Roman Missal became effective in 2011.
- The contents of these documents have been received and implemented over the years of the last three Bishops of our Diocese.

- The Bishop, through the assistance of the Diocesan Office of Worship, provides Diocesan guidelines that puts the parishes of the Diocese in compliance with the Church documents, in particular the GIRM.
- The Diocesan Guidelines reinforce the GIRM in calling for the ability to kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer, the solidity of the Tabernacle and its visibility by the congregation, and the location of altar, ambo, and presider's chair. All parishes planning any work on their Church building are now required to entail a plan for compliance with the GIRM.
- The proposed plan would bring us into full compliance with the GIRM and bring beauty, and reverence to our Worship Space.





FINANCIAL PLAN

Bob Miller, chair of the Finance Committee, offered the proposed financing plan:

- ♦ Capital Campaign
- ◆ The estimated cost of the project is \$1.5 million. 1/3 will be paid from the parish savings.
- ◆ A \$1 million loan from the Diocese of Saginaw.
 15 year term (current interest rate is 4%)
 180 payments of \$7400 per month from the parish.
- ♦ 550 Active & Participating Households
